

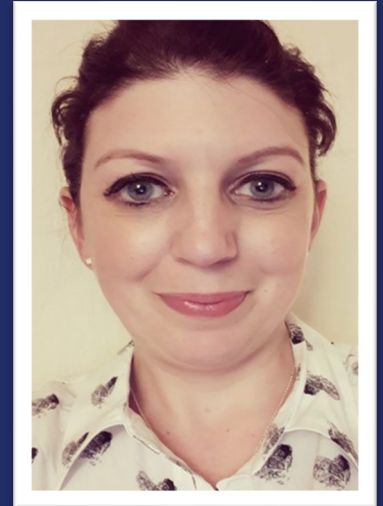

## *Forensic Archaeology and Development of Fingermarks in Extreme Environments*

The presentation will outline Zoe's experience as a 2019 Churchill Fellow. The objectives of her project will be presented, and the findings discussed within the context of Zoe's ongoing research into identifying optimum methods for maximising fingerprint evidence from commodity burials by criminal entities.

### About the Speaker:

Zoe is a forensic archaeologist with 13 years' experience as a CSI across the UK, in areas including fire investigation, human remains identification and outdoor body recovery. She has also carried out research on the development of fingerprints on polymer banknotes and buried evidence. Now a Lecturer in Forensic Studies at the University of Portsmouth, Zoe continues to work as a forensic consultant in disaster response, including the 2017 Grenfell Tower fire. In 2019, Zoe was awarded a Churchill Fellowship to meet forensic practitioners and researchers across Australia and Canada.
